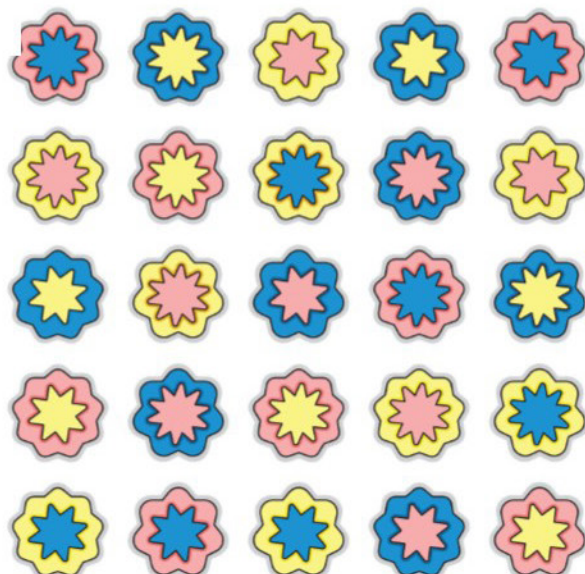


The floral field hides two exactly identical starry flowers. Can you find those twins?
